Honours grants**

**Guidelines for Applicants**

The National Stroke Foundation is funding small support grants for Honours students undertaking a thesis in the area of stroke research.

The grants are a one off opportunity for the year commencing for the 2010 academic year. The value of the grant is \$3000.

Two funding rounds will be promoted

Funding Round 1: Applications for this grant must be received by 12 October 2009

**Funding Round 2: Applications for this grant must be received by 22 MARCH 2010.**

**Who may apply?**

Any Honours student enrolled at an Australian University and completing a thesis in an area of stroke research, is eligible for the grant. Grants will be made to students in the areas of allied health, nursing and basic science.

**What may be funded?**

The grant is to support successful applicants for the duration of their Honours year. The grant will be made as a one off payment at the beginning of the year

**Conditions**

1. Grant recipients are required to provide a final report to the National Stroke Foundation 12 months after the awarding of the grant. This report is to be in a language able to be understood by a lay person, no longer than one page, and accompanied by a photograph suitable for publication purposes in the Foundation newsletter and on the website.
2. Grant recipients are to acknowledge the National Stroke Foundation as the provider of the grant wherever possible, such as in media interviews, and on papers and publications relating to the research.
3. Grant recipients should be available to participate in National Stroke Foundation events where requested, and be available to act as a reviewer for future applications.

**Format for Applications**

***Cover Page***

1. Applicants: Names (student and supervisor)
2. Contact details: Student's address, telephone and email.
3. Specific but brief title of the project
4. Brief description of the project to be undertaken in the Honours year (in lay language (200 words))
5. Academic transcript from previous related coursework

1. Aims
2. Hypotheses
3. Research plan
4. Significance
5. Budget
6. Scientific reference list

Applications must be presented in Times Roman, 12 point font, and single spaced.
